Dear Inbound Students and Rebound Students,

You are invited to the *Saturday afternoon portion* of the District 5100 January Outbound Orientation at:

4-H Conference & Education Center
5390 4-H Road NW
Salem, Oregon 97304
Please see the attached maps

This annual Outbound Candidate event will be held Friday-Sunday, January 9-11, 2015. *You are invited to join the new Outbound Candidates on Saturday afternoon, January 10 for the Country Fair, Rebound Panel, and dinner.*

Please arrive 12:45-1:15pm, Saturday, January 10 (eat lunch before you arrive)
Arrange to depart 7:00pm, Saturday, January 10 (unless you are from the coast or eastern Oregon)

Check in at the John Gray Building gym. Dress casually, neat and well groomed.

Country Fair Details:

The Country Fair will be at 2:15. *Please bring flags, costumes, photos, or anything you'd like to wear or display to promote your country. The whole idea is to "sell" your country to next year's Outbound Candidates.*

There is limited electricity in the gym, so make sure your laptop is charged and able to run off the battery for the event. *No music or audio*, as it gets very loud in the gym. Bring any set-up supplies you may need (like tape!).

We will leave some of the Country Fair up overnight so a few previously selected students may present a smaller version to the parents on Sunday morning.

Rebound Panel:

Some Rebounds will be invited to participate in the Rebound Panel on Saturday afternoon following the Country Fair.

Your Role & Expectations:

You are being invited to promote Rotary youth exchange and to be a good example of what this program is all about. You are expected to adhere to facility rules and Rotary youth exchange rules while you are at this event. It goes without saying that you are expected to “be on your best behavior”.

Bring the following:

1. Money, if you wish to purchase a Rotary Youth Exchange T-Shirt or sweatshirt (\$20 to \$40). *This may be your last chance to buy them.*
2. Flashlight, *this place gets dark!*
3. Wet weather gear - jacket, umbrella, etc. (Flip flops are a bad idea at this camp).
4. A camera (optional). Label it with your name if you want it back!
5. Anything you'd like to display for the Country Fair.

DO NOT bring iPods or any other electronic devices, unless you need to use them for the Country Fair. Leave your cell phone in the car. Remember, Outbound Candidates are not allowed to bring these things, so please keep yours put away.

The map included with this letter will show you how to get to the 4-H Conference & Education Center. If using GPS, ignore the Brooks turn off instruction and it should correct itself. Please follow the map.





Directions to the 4-H Center

From Portland via I-5

1. Take I-5 South to the Salem Parkway Exit. Exit right. Bear to the right and drive approximately 4.6 miles on the Parkway and Commercial Street. (The Parkway becomes Commercial Street just past the Fred Meyer store.
2. Drive South on Commercial and turn right at the Marion Street Bridge.
3. Cross the Willamette River on the Marion Street Bridge, staying in either of the two right lanes and follow the signs onto Wallace Road.
4. Drive North approximately 2 miles and turn left onto Brush College Road.
5. Drive approximately 5 miles on Brush College Road. Turn left onto 4-H Road.
6. Drive uphill to the end of the pavement. **Remember: The speed limit while in camp is 10 mph.**
7. If you are going to either Horse Camp or Greider, take the right-hand gate and drive downhill. Stay on the improved road. Horse Camp is the first group of buildings, including a barn, an arena and a bathhouse. If you are going to Greider, pass through Horse Camp and continue downhill. Greider Lodge will be on your right as you reach the meadow.
8. If you are going to the Core area, take the left-hand gate and drive uphill. Signs will direct you to the area you are staying.

From Eugene via I-5

1. Drive I-5 North to the Exit 253 Santiam Pass. Exit right and turn left onto Mission Street at the light.
2. Drive West on Mission Street approximately 2 miles and turn right onto Liberty Street.
3. Drive North on Liberty Street and turn left onto Marion Street.



4. Follow directions 3-8 above.

From the West:

Take Hwy 22 to the Rickreall intersection at Hwy 99, just east of Dallas. Turn north toward McMinnville and travel approximately 6 miles to the McCoy/Bethel junction. There will be an intersection with a flashing yellow light. Turn right (east) on Bethel Road and travel approximately 5.2 miles to Spring Valley Road. Turn right (south) on Spring Valley Road, go 1 block and turn right on Brush College Road. Follow Brush College Road around Zena (Spring Valley) Church and travel approximately .25 mile. Look for the signs for “YMCA Camp Greider” and “The 4-H Center”. The road will split – the left Y will be Brush College Road; the straight ahead (uphill) road is 4-H Road. Follow instructions 6-8 above.
